

Amendments to the Champions Motions

Motion #1:

Moved by Gail Kovacs that the CVRP Board of Directors approves the Government Regulation Joint Committee

Terms of Reference as previously presented and attached to the Committee's report.

Seconded by:

Motion to change the Motion #1:

*Moved by Kelvin Brown that motion #1 be changed to read the CVRP Board of Directors approves a **Joint Government Relations Committee** together with VRAC. The College member will be a member of the Communications Committee.*

The College has been regulated for 5 years. Should the situation occur that a province begin to investigate the regulation of its VR professionals, at that time a Joint regulation Committee may be warranted and the association and College will need members of the committee from the interested province to participate.

Moved by Gail Kovacs that the CVRP Board of Directors establishes an adhoc Government Regulation Risk Management Committee to review the current and potential risks, financial and otherwise, to government regulation.

Motion to Change Motion #2:

*Moved by Kelvin Brown that Motion #2 be changed to read the CVRP Board of Directors establishes an adhoc **Risk Management Committee** to continuously review current and potential risks, to our profession.*

The College is responsible for regulation. The Association is responsible for communication, education and representation (insurance)

There is definitely a mutual need to identify and address risks to the profession.

Moved by Warren Comeau that the CVRP Board of Directors approves reopening “grandfathering” into the College until VRA and other potential credentials are transitioned into the College and other non-exam based options for registration are taken into consideration / ruled in or out.

Motion to Change Motion #3:

Moved by Kelvin Brown that Motion #3 be changed to read the CVRP Board of Directors approves a VR Vets (Vocational Rehabilitation veterans) outreach program to recruit and certify VR Vets from associations across Canada into the College. The initiative will introduce options to obtain certification and last for three (3) years from the date of Board approval.

With this initiative it is believed that VRAC and other related associations will cease to credential their members.
